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New York State Crime Update January – March 2007 vs 2006

Preliminary Data Subject to Change

This report provides the most recent crime trend information available on the number of Index crimes of murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft reported within New York State. It displays totals for selected counties and for agencies within that county who have submitted reports for January – March 2007. District attorneys' offices and police departments now have an up-to-date picture of crime in their entire county and other areas of the state. Only agencies with complete reporting are included. New York City data is not yet available.

New York State law enforcement agencies have reported approximately 88 percent of crime data for the first quarter of 2007. Counties outside of New York City, are showing a decrease in nearly every crime category. The IMPACT counties, which include Albany, Broome, Chautauqua, Dutchess, Erie, Monroe, Nassau, Niagara, Oneida, Onondaga, Orange, Rensselaer, Rockland, Schenectady, Suffolk, Ulster, and Westchester, are driving the statewide trend.

All Counties Outside New York City

- Overall, reported crime is down (-8%)
- Violent crime is down (-13%), with robbery down (-24%) and aggravated assault down (-7%). Reported rapes are down (-8%)
- Property crime is down (-8%), with burglary down (-9%), larceny down (-6%) and motor vehicle theft down (-14%)

IMPACT Counties

- Overall, reported crime is down (-8%)
- Violent crime is down (-15%), with robbery down (-23%) and aggravated assault down (-9%). Reported rapes are down (-11%)
- Property crime is down (-7%), with burglary down (-8%), larceny down (-6%) and motor vehicle theft down (-16%)
