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Criminal Justice Statistical Report

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Felony Insurance Fraud Offenses 2022 Annual Report

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New York State Executive Law requires the state Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to publish an annual report detailing arrests and prosecutions for felony offenses included in state Insurance Fraud Law (Penal Law Article 176).

Table 1 details arrests for these crimes annually for the five-year period from 2018 through 2022 for New York State and its two regions: New York City (five boroughs) and Non-New York City (57 counties).

The regional designation is based on the location of the arrest.

These data are reported to DCJS by the police agency that made the arrest and are maintained in the agency's Computerized Criminal History (CCH) database. DCJS compiles arrest data by top charge: the most serious an individual faced at the time of arrest. For example, if an arrest included one felony and one misdemeanor charge, that arrest is classified as a felony.

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Table 2 details the number of indictments or superior court information (SCIs) where the top charge was a felony insurance fraud offense. The year represents the year in which the arraignment or the indictment or SCI occurred, as reported to DCJS by the state Office of Court Administration. In addition:

If a single indictment or SCI included charges against more than one individual, the indictment or SCI is counted multiple times in Table 2 (for example, an indictment or SCI charging three individuals is counted three times). The same is true if an individual is named in multiple indictments or SCIs: each indictment or SCI is reflected in Table 2 separately.

Please note: A single arrest may result in more than one indictment or SCI and multiple arrests may result in one indictment or SCI.

Tables 3 through 5 provide information about the outcomes of felony insurance fraud arrests. The summaries are displayed according to the year in which the final disposition occurred. For example, a 2018 arrest that resulted in a conviction in 2019 is included in the 2019 dispositions. In addition:

- An arrest made for an Insurance Fraud felony may result in a conviction to a different Penal Law offense.
- An arrest made for a felony may result in a conviction to a felony, misdemeanor or non-criminal offense.
