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Caseload Explorer (CE) Check-In Continues to Assist Probation Departments

DCJS expedited the implementation of Caseload Explorer (CE) "Check-In" in late March 2020 to support web-based reporting by individuals under probation supervision, at no additional expense to probation departments. At that time, AutoMon Inc. conducted statewide training for probation officers and staff on implementing and using the Check-In product. The most recent CE Check-In report indicated that 40 probation departments were actively using the system and effectively leveraging the power of electronic

Nearly 275 probation professionals participated in a webinar on the New York Ignition Interlock Program, specifically regarding the New Caseload Explorer Functionality and Reports hosted by DCJS. The training program highlighted three new reports to assist probation officers.

- The "Ignition Interlock Order Received" report which will assist jurisdictions in monitoring the submission of court orders/referrals;
• The "Court Responses to VOP and Warrant Requests" report, which will assist jurisdictions in monitoring responses to violations of probations and warrant requests to ensure that the courts are responding within statutorily required timelines; and

- Enhancing quarterly reports to report operator non-compliance to the courts and district attorney's offices.

Information on IID-related reports in the IJ Portal, specifically, the "Parolee Requiring IID" and the "Persons Convicted of Leandra's Law Qualifying Offense," was also provided.

NYS Probation Commission Meets and Reflects on COVID-19

The New York State Probation Commission convened virtually on Dec. 3 for its semi-annual meeting. The state director invited New York State Council of Probation Administrators (NYSCOPA) President Steve Bayle and New York State Probation Officers Association (NYSPOA) President Gladys Larson to call-in and provide perspectives on how probation departments and probation officers were responding to COVID-19. Probation directors were invited to listen in. With the resurgence of the COVID-19, many probation de-

partments are flexing operations and managing probationer contacts and supervision through electronic means, while many departments continue to see high/greatest risk probationers in the office and in the community. Managers from the Office of Probation and Correctional Alternatives (OPCA) reported on their respective areas of responsibilities and how they have continued operations through virtual trainings and communications with probation departments.

ICAOS Regulations and Timely Issuance of Interstate Warrants—New Required Face-Sheets

DCJS has worked with the Office of Court Administration, the New York City Department of Probation and local probation departments to implement statewide use of Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision warrant processing face-sheets to identify the distinctive requests for the timely issuance of warrants for interstate probationer absconders, probation violators and probationers who commit new felonies or violent crimes. The use of the distinctive face-sheets is to signal the need to issue and upload into the NCIC the warrant within 15 business days.

DVSI-R: Completion of Summary Risk Rating Questions Required for Accurate Assessment

In September 2018, OPCA contracted with Kirk Williams, Ph.D., author of the Domestic Violence Screening Instrument-Revised (DVSI-R), and Joseph DiTunno, of the Connecticut Judicial Branch, and trained 34 probation officers, who in turn became certified DVSI-R trainers and conducted numerous end-user trainings. Through their remarkable efforts, over 500 probation officers have now been trained to use the DVSI-R. Through the first three quarters of 2020, DCJS identified more than 1,100 DVSI-R screens that were accessed online using the Northpointe/Equivant suite, via the NYCOMPAS

alternative screens. A review of the data revealed that additional training was needed for the required completion of the "Summary Risk Rating" questions within the DVSI-R screen. On Jan. 20, OPCA will host a WebEx event to provide additional DVSI-R training to address specific use of the "Summary Risk Rating" questions within the DVSI-R screen. Probation Practice Tips

PINS Referral – Legal jurisdiction for PINS proceedings lies with the locality where the PINS behavior occurred, unless the child lives in a county other than the one where the behaviors transpired. In that case, the matter may be referred to the county of residence. Please see [NYCRR Part 357.4 “Jurisdiction”](#) for further details.

Virtual Home Contacts – Home contact is defined in Part 351 of Title 9 NYCRR as “going to the probationer’s home to verify residence, assess living conditions, monitor probationer compliance with the conditions of probation, discuss case plan, and/or address service needs.” While a video walkthrough may be informative, it does not appear to meet the definition. Officers shall reflect in case notes that the contact via Zoom/Skype/Teams occurred, but it does not satisfy the required home contact. Collateral contacts with the probationer’s family, roommates could be accomplished via virtual platforms. Please refer to State Director Memorandum # 2020-3 regarding Emergency Probation Procedures (COVID-19). This guidance allows localities to suspend home contacts if deemed necessary, but the guidance did not specifically discuss substitution of home contacts with electronic means. The guidance did specifically address probationer contacts.

Probation Best Practice

OPCA recently observed a best practice being utilized by the Orleans County Probation Department when filing a Violation of Probation Petition and Declaration of Delinquency. The Department cites Criminal Procedure Law (CPL) Section 410.30 and Section 410.40 in a letter to the court, providing an effective reminder of the requirements of the law and helping ensure timely execution of the violation of probation.

- *Per CPL Section 410.30 of the when the court receives a request for a declaration of delinquency by a Probation Officer it shall make a decision on such request within seventy-two hours of its receipt of the request.*
- *Per CPL Section 410.40 “where the court issues a notice to appear, the court shall direct that the defendant appear within ten days of the court’s order.”*

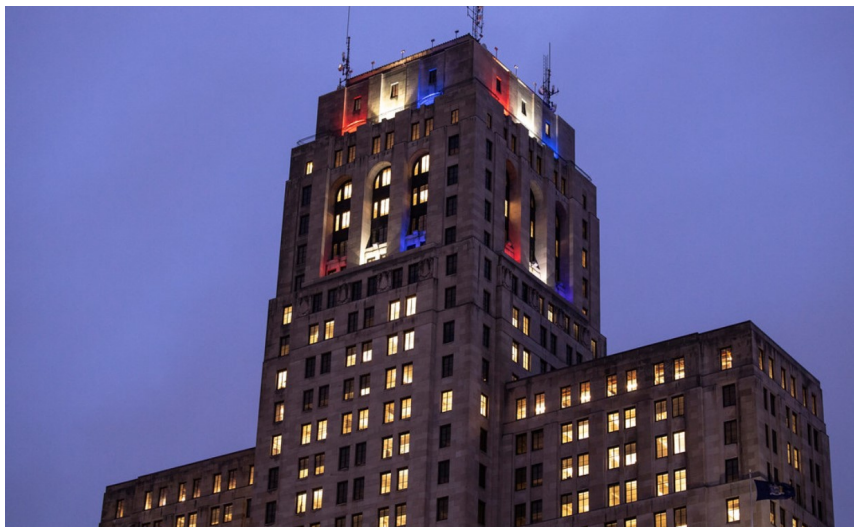
