8. Approval of Standard 41.3 revision

Gabriele Marruso explained to the council that the office of public safety is proposing a revision to standard 41.3 in response to community doxing. Doxing is to search for and publish private or identifying information about (a particular individual) on the internet, typically with malicious intent. With the recent civil unrest many officers have become the target of doxing placing officers and their family at risk. We are proposing that an agency permit an officer to be identified to alternatives to typical name plates. Especially in high risk situations like riots or rallies. An

example would be using badge number instead of an officer's last name.

Supervisor Theobald made a motion to accept the revision to standard 41.3 and Sergeant Dini seconded the motion.

9. Approval of Standard 8.5 revision

Mr. Marruso explained to that council that recently the MU-1 and CO-2 have been consolidated into LGS -1. After review, it did not appear to cover certain state agencies or interstate agencies, so language was added to do so.
