I am writing this letter in response to variance 20-V-17, which permits male officers to supervise female prisoners/detainees under certain conditions, which is to expire May 1, 2021.

As stated in our department's earlier request for a variance regarding our department's failure to meet the minimum standard Part 7504 Supervision of Detention Areas, section 7504.1 (e) our department is currently comprised of 13 male officers, no female officers. Our department is fully staffed at this time and it is unknown the future staffing demographics of our department. It would be my hope in the future to hire a female officer, but at this time we are not hiring. At this time and until further notice we can not meet the minimum standard set forth by the State of New York regarding section 7504.1 (e).

As a representative for the Medina Police Department, I am requesting an extension or long-term variance (until our department hires a female) for section 7504.1 (e) to be in compliance.

SUMMARY OF VARIANCE REQUEST

Chautauqua County Jail Administrator James Crowell is requesting a variance to provide incarcerated individuals with photocopies of all non-privileged incoming correspondence in lieu of the original correspondence. Jail Administrator Crowell further notes that the facility proposes to copy no-privileged correspondence and deliver to the incarcerated individual within 1 business day of receiving such mail from the U.S. Postal Service or any other mail delivery services.

RECOMMENDATION BY STAFF

It is recommended this variance be approved until July 1, 2021.

RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS IF APPROVED

Pursuant to this action, the following conditions shall apply:

- 1. Only non-privileged incoming correspondence and accompanying envelope may be photocopied and provided to the recipient prisoner. Incoming privileged correspondence shall be provided to the recipient prisoner and is not to be photocopied.
- Incoming general and legal privileged correspondence shall be opened and inspected for contraband in the presence of the recipient prisoner. <u>The facility may use a drug</u> <u>detecting device to scan privileged correspondence for illicit drugs only in the presence of</u> the recipient prisoner.
- 3. Approval of this variance does not relieve the facility from its duty to comply with United States Postal Services' regulations and statutes.
- 4. Except for incoming non-general and legal privileged correspondence forwarded to the chief administrative officer, the facility shall make available correspondence for inmate view within <u>one business day</u> of delivery by the United States Postal Service.
- 5. The facility shall ensure that inmates are provided, at no cost, the opportunity to:
 - a. be provided with their original correspondence and enclosed contents (i.e., photos, cards, etc.), that are non-criminal in nature, immediately upon release/transfer from the facility; and

- b. be permitted to designate a person(s) who may obtain such original correspondence from the facility.
- 6. The facility shall provide inmates the opportunity to have their original correspondence forwarded to a third party.
- 7. All relevant protocols concerning the photocopying of correspondence shall be included in the facility's inmate rulebook. If the rulebook is not yet scheduled for reprinting, such information shall be posted conspicuously in all housing areas until such reprinting has been completed and issued.
- 8. Any costs associated with the correspondence photocopying program shall be borne by the facility and not through the use of commissary profits.
- 9. The facility ensures that all correspondence-related reportable incidents are submitted to the Commission in accordance with Part 7022, Reportable Incidents.



- 2. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

II. MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS:

- 1. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 50 square feet of floor space per incarcerated individual in the sleeping area.
- 2. Each such unit shall house no more than 60 incarcerated individuals.
- Each such unit shall have a bed and mattress for each incarcerated individual.
- 4. Each such unit shall have at least:
 - One (1) functioning toilet for every 12 incarcerated individuals;
 - One (1) functioning shower for every 15 incarcerated individuals; and
 - One (1) functioning sink for every 12 incarcerated individuals.
- 5. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 25 square feet of dayroom space immediately adjacent and accessible to the sleeping area.

EXCEPTIONS:

1. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

1. The requirements as stipulated in I and II apply to all housing units consisting of both individual and multiple occupancy housing units.

UNITS WHICH MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO 9 NYCRR PART 7040 ARE TO BE INCLUDED IN THE MAXIMUM FACILITY CAPACITY

FORMULATION.

I. INDIVIDUAL OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS:

- 1. Each such unit shall only house one (1) incarcerated individual and contain at least 60 square feet of floor space.
- 2. Each such individual occupancy housing unit shall contain:
 - One (1) bed and mattress:
 - One (1) functioning toilet; and
 - One (1) functioning sink.
- 3. Sufficient showers shall be available to permit each incarcerated individual to shower daily.
- 4. Each tier or section of individual housing units constructed after the effective date of 9 NYCRR 7040 shall provide dayroom space adjacent and accessible to such tier or section.

EXCEPTIONS:

- 1. A unit may contain less than 60 square feet of floor space if such unit was originally constructed for single occupancy prior to the effective date of 9 NYCRR Part 7040.
- 2. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

II. MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY HOUSING UNITS:

- 1. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 50 square feet of floor space per incarcerated individual in the sleeping area.
- 2. Each such unit shall house no more than 60 incarcerated individuals.
- Each such unit shall have a bed and mattress for each incarcerated individual.
- 4. Each such unit shall have at least:
 - One (1) functioning toilet for every 12 incarcerated individuals;
 - One (1) functioning shower for every 15 incarcerated individuals; and
 - One (1) functioning sink for every 12 incarcerated individuals.
- 5. Each such unit shall provide a minimum of 25 square feet of dayroom space immediately adjacent and accessible to the sleeping area.

EXCEPTIONS:

1. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

III. UNITS CONTAINING BOTH INDIVIDUAL AND MULTIPLE OCCUPANCY HOUSING:

1. The requirements as stipulated in I and II apply to all housing units consisting of both individual and multiple occupancy housing units.

EXCEPTIONS:

- 1. A unit may contain less than 60 square feet of floor space if such unit was originally constructed for single occupancy prior to the effective date of 9 NYCRR Part 7040.
- 2. Each such unit used to house incarcerated individuals apart from general population for the purpose of medical observation or treatment shall have a minimum of 80 square feet of floor space.

IV. NON-HOUSING AREAS USED FOR THE TEMPORARY DETENTION OF INDIVIDUALS

1. These are used to identify areas within the facility that are used for the temporary detention of individuals. These areas do not increase the capacity of the facility.

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STATE COMMISSION OF CORRECTION FIVE YEAR REVIEW OF RULES ADOPTED BY THE STATE COMMISSION OF CORRECTION IN CALENDAR YEARS 2001, 2006, 2011 and 2016 REQUIRED TO BE REVIEWED IN CALENDAR YEAR 2021

As required by Chapter 262 of the Laws of 1996, the following is a list of rules which were adopted by the State Commission of Correction in calendar years 2001, 2006, 2011, and 2016 which must be reviewed in calendar year 2021. Public comment on the continuation or modification of these rules was invited. No comments were received. Based upon the belief that said rules further the Commission's mission to provide for a safe, stable and humane correctional system in New York State, and absent public comment to the contrary, the Commission has determined and hereby gives notice pursuant to State Administrative Procedure Act \$207(4) that the rules listed below shall continue without modification.

CMC-03-01-00002 Amendment of subdivision (a) of section 7028.2 and subdivision (c) of section 7028.4 of Title 9 NYCRR.

Analysis of the need for the rule: The rule is needed to clarify the situations when outdoor exercise at local correctional facilities may be canceled.

Legal basis for the rule: Correction Law section 45(6).

CMC-43-00-0005 Amendment of section 7621.6, renumber 7621.7-11 to be 7621.8-12 and addition of new section 7621.7 of Title 9 NYCRR.

Analysis of the need for the rule: The rule is needed to provide minimum standards for the use of double occupancy housing units originally designated and constructed for double occupancy.

Legal basis for the rule: Correction Law section 45(6).

CMC-06-11-00001-P Amendment of section 7003.10 of Title 9 NYCRR.

Analysis of the need for the rule: The rule is needed to extend the intervals within which locks and securing devices must be inspected.

Legal basis for the rule: Correction Law sections 45(6) and 45(15).

CMC-06-11-00002-P Amendment of section7063.6 of Title 9 NYCRR.

Analysis of the need for the rule: The rule is needed to extend the intervals within which certain chemical agents must be inspected.

Legal basis for the rule: Correction Law sections 45(6) and 45(15).

CMC-45-15-00024-A Amendment of sections 7022.3, 7022.4, 7406.3, 7406.4 and 7508.2 of Title 9 NYCRR.

Analysis of the need for the rule: The rule is needed to allow electronic filing of reportable incidents to the Commission of Correction. Legal basis for the rule: Correction Law sections 45(6), 45(6-b), 45(15) and 47(2).
